## $2^{\text {nd }}$ Grade Homework reminder:

*Please remember to read and record on the reading fluency sheet every night. Monday is Ist read and answer questions on Reading fluency sheet. After they answer the questions, then they read for one minute. Only record the number of words read in the minute, not words on the whole sheet. So if a child reads 93 words in the minute, and has 3 errors, their score would be 90 words per minute. Please remember that Reading fluency homework is due on Friday morning. It is not a race. It is more important to read with fluency and accuracy than speed.
