

Book Reports

The **book reports** for next year may be worked on over the summer. Students need to read 16 books (any genre) at third grade level or above, and complete a book report on each book. Book levels can be found from the Lexile links on the **Parent** page. When you get to the Lexile page, look in the upper right corner and type in the name of your book. Sometimes, you will need to search for the author, and then look for your book. The year-end Lexile range for third grade is 500-800. Utilize your Lexile report from the end of second grade to determine reading books for summer. Try to read books that fall within the range of 100 below to 50 above your child's reading level for book reports.

Additional notes on supplies

- Please keep things simple—no "cutesy" toys that will distract and/or break. We have limited space and each student's supplies are expected to fit into their space neatly.
- Except where specified, color, design, and number do not matter to me—let your child pick what he/she likes.
- 3. Optional supplies

o Water bottle—must have a lid and **may hold ONLY water**. No pop, fruit juice, etc. is allowed.

Supply List

Third Grade Supply List

- 1-Backpack
- 5-Pocket folders: Label them"Homework,"
 "Work in Progress," "Reading," "Writing," and
 "Math."
- Make sure you get <u>2 folders</u> without the brads in them—they just need pockets; <u>3 folders</u> need the brads
- Twistable colored Pencils
- Two black markers—thin tipped, for writing and outlining on colored construction paper
- 4 Glue Sticks
- Minimum of 24 #2 pencils—these will be turned in to class supply. NO mechanical pencils
- 1 Grading pen (can be purple, red, green, etc. (No blue or black)
- erasers
- Pencil box—these need to be small to hold colored pencils and extra pencils
- Scissors
- Headphones/earbuds to use with the computers
- 2 Bottles of Germ-X
- 1 clear-view 1 inch binder
- 25 top load page protectors: put the page protectors in the 1 inch binder
- Package of 2 dry erase markers-black, thin tip
- Eraser for dry erase board
- 2 bottles of cleaning wet wipes—not hand wipes
- 3 boxes of Kleenex
- 2 rolls of paper towels
- One box of oil pastel crayons (these are usually with the paint supplies) If you check the parent page for the supply list—I will put a link there to show you what they are if you are unsure.
